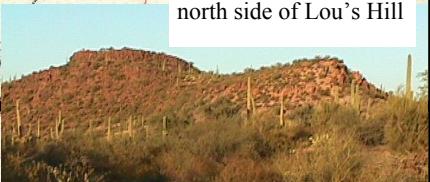


# ROCKING M RANCH TRAIL MAP

## NOTES

- Not all trails marked or marked correctly. Coyote Pass and Cactus Canyon each have one wrong markers.
- Stay off closed trails.
- Keep horses on trails.

# Safety Tips

## PRESERVING THE DESERT:

Help preserve the unique natural features of the park while assuring your personal safety and that of other visitors.

- Hiking group size is limited to a maximum of 18 persons when hiking on designated trails.
- To preserve the desert, try to avoid off trail travel. If you must go off trail, limit the party to 10 people.
- Pets are prohibited on the trails and in the backcountry, but are permitted on leash around picnic areas or around the visitor center.
- Plants, animals, rocks, wood, and other natural features must be left undisturbed.
- Firearms and other weapons are prohibited,
- Carry out all trash.
- Report any damage of park resources to a park ranger.
- Bicycles are permitted only on roadways.
- About stock:
  - Stock are prohibited from traveling off-trail throughout the park
  - Stock groups are limited to a maximum of 15 animals when riding on designated trails.
  - Stock are prohibited on the short walks and nature trails, Hugh Norris Trail, King Canyon Trail from the Sweet-water Junction to the Hugh Norris trail, Cactus Wren Trail south of the Encinas Trail, Manville Trail from Signal Hill Picnic area to Manville Road, Bajada Wash Trail from Valley View Overlook Trail to Sus Picnic Area, Signal Hill Picnic Area, Sus Picnic Area, and Red Hills Visitor Center.
- All visitor access is prohibited in the sensitive resource area near the Red Hills Visitor Center.
- State Trust Lands: For access information and permits, call the Arizona State Land Department at 520-628-5480.

## Safety Tips

- Hiking and other strenuous activities in extreme heat can be hazardous. Pace yourself and rest often. Carry water (at least one gallon per person per day) and drink even when you don't feel thirsty. Hats and sunscreen are recommended.
- Be aware that encounters with cacti and other prickly plants can be painful. Be especially careful near cholla cactus spines, which with the slightest touch, can become embedded in your skin. If a cactus joint attaches itself to you, do not grab it. Use two sticks, a comb, or other objects as a lever to flip away the joint.
- Look out for rattlesnakes during spring, summer, and fall months. Stay on trails and do not disturb snakes if you encounter them.
- For your safety, do not enter any mine shafts.
- Stay on designated trails.
- Picture Rocks, Sandario, and Kinney Roads have heavy vehicle traffic. Use caution crossing roads.
- Lock vehicles and not leave valuables in your vehicles.
- Cellular service is available through much of the park.
